## 4. Healthy Living #2: Growing Strong Through Active Play

Regular physical activity is essential for children aged 7 to 12. It supports healthy growth, strengthens bones and muscles, and enhances concentration and emotional well-being. Age-appropriate activities such as running, cycling, swimming, skipping, dancing and playground games help develop coordination, endurance and confidence.

Both team sports and individual activities contribute to a child's development. Team sports such as football, basketball and floorball foster teamwork, communication and resilience, while individual activities like swimming, martial arts, running and cycling allow children to progress at their own pace and build self-confidence. Exposure to a variety of activities helps children discover their interests and sustain an active lifestyle.

Most importantly, exercise should be enjoyable and play-based. Family walks, outdoor play and active games with friends can keep children motivated while nurturing positive lifelong habits towards physical activity.

## 5. Growth Mindset Nuggets #3: The Power of “Yet” in CCAs

Adopting a growth mindset in CCAs means celebrating the process of learning, rather than focusing only on final scores or performances. When pupils miss a goal during the National School Games (NSG) or struggle with a musical passage in the Singapore Youth Festival (SYF), they can apply the “Power of Yet” — reminding themselves that they have not mastered the skill yet, but can improve through consistent effort and practice.

By reframing challenges and adjusting their self-talk from “I’m not good at this” to “I’m still learning and improving,” pupils begin to see their CCA as a space for growth rather than pressure. This builds resilience, perseverance and confidence.

A growth mindset is not about being the best; it is about becoming better than before. In CCAs, the aim is not to produce professionals, but to help pupils grow in character. Developing the grit to keep trying is a life skill that will stay with them long after they step off the field or stage.
