Pupils can practise inclusivity and nurture a growth mindset every day by:

- **Encouraging classmates for their effort, not just their results.**
Instead of focusing solely on who scored the highest or won, notice and praise the hard work, persistence, and creativity your friends show. This helps everyone see that progress is more important than perfection.
- **Including friends who may feel left out or need support.**
Simple acts—like inviting a classmate to join a group activity, partnering with someone new, or offering a helping hand—build a stronger sense of belonging. Everyone learns better when they feel included and accepted.
- **Using positive self-talk: "I can improve if I keep trying."**
Challenges can be tough but remind yourself and others that mistakes are part of learning. Saying "I can't do this yet, but I will learn" helps build confidence and resilience, encouraging others to do the same.

Together, let us continue to build a community where every child feels supported to grow, included in learning, and inspired to give their best.
